

- Scorecard Committee Role
  - Composed of reps from NC BoS CoC Regional Committees, at-large members and staffed by NCCEH
  - Meets each year to create the scorecards used for scoring new and renewal project applications for the CoC Funding Competition
    - Provide best possible rubric to rank 2022 Competition Projects
    - Review 2021 CoC Competition Scorecards
    - Determine and recommend necessary changes
- CoC Competition Overview
  - CoC Applications
    - 2 types
      - New projects
      - Renewal projects
        - 30 projects are eligible for renewal
    - Current grants
      - 21 permanent supportive housing projects
      - 7 rapid rehousing projects
      - 2 not scored (HMIS, SSO-CE)
      - 1 not scored or ranked (NC BoS CoC Planning)
  - CoC Competition Review and Ranking
    - CoCs must rank and tier projects based on:
      - Performance
      - HUD and CoC Priorities
    - Scorecards help us rank projects and set priorities for ranking
  - Rank & Tier
    - The Project Review Committee (PRC) and NCCEH staff review each programmatic project using the CoC's scorecards
    - The PRC then ranks the projects in order of performance and priority
    - HUD requires CoCs to split our eligible funds into two tiers

FY2022 CoC Grant Competition Timeline



- NOFO not yet released as of 4/26/22, probably will be released during late summer
- Scorecard Introduction
  - 4 goals
    - 1. Fund organizations that have the capacity to run effective groups
    - 2. Fund projects that reflect the NC BoS CoC's and HUD's priorities
      - Very specific priorities
    - 3. Incentivize agencies to be good partners
    - 4. Ensure that funded projects are being good stewards of NC BoS CoC funding and performing to CoC standards
  - 2 scorecards
    - New greater focus on agency capacity and experience
    - Renewal greater focus on grant performance
    - Both New and Renewal same basic standards of program design
  - Scorecards have 2 parts
    - Part 1: Combined Scoring
      - Scored by NCCEH staff and 1 member of PRC
        - Then meet to discuss scorecards
      - Scores are averaged
    - Part 2: Staff Scoring
      - Scored by NCCEH staff only
      - Focused on technical questions and performance, more objective answers to review
  - 4 key categories
    - 1. Thresholds
      - a. Applications MUST meet all thresholds in order to be considered
      - b. Ex:
        - i. New projects must meet application deadlines
        - ii. New projects demonstrate Housing First philosophy
    - 2. Standards

- Standards are items that should be met by all NC BoS CoC projects
- b. If not met, further review is "triggered"
- c. Points not awarded, as these should be met by all projects
  - Options on scorecards are Met, Unmet, Unmet-documentation not provided, NA
  - ii. PRC uses standards as part of the ranking process
    - 1. SAMHSA's PSH Key Elements
    - 2. NAEH RRH Performance Benchmarks and Program Standards
    - 3. Housing First (renewal projects)

#### 3. Section Minimums

- a. Each section of the scorecards have a minimum listed
- b. If not met, further review is "triggered"
- c. Goal is to ensure all projects meet a basic level of performance in each section of the scorecard

#### 4. Points

- a. At the bottom level of the ranking process and used for tie breakers
- b. Based on project performance
- c. Using data to measure performance is important
- d. Projects are scored on data including:
  - Targeting serving people with disabilities, chronically homeless, etc.
  - ii. Exits to permanent housing
  - iii. Increases in income
- e. Pulls the highest performing programs to the top of the ranking list
