4. Project HOPE

- We received over 1297 applications that were eligible for assistance. (The ones rejected initially were over the income limit or were home owners)
- 894 after the state came In and took over utilities only
- 480 moved through and completed, 448 more applications to be processed
- As of today we have processed over 200 applications and payment has been issued. There are at least another 100 more that is still waiting to be processed.
- As of now, the program will continue through the end of February 2021.
- Possible rental arrears assistance through NC Emergency Solutions office in the works in the future as well as project HOPE

5. B@H Program COVID/CRF Funds

- SFVC has started housing individuals. There are currently four households that have been housed and at least three more looking for housing.
- Provides six months of rental assistance as well as six month of utility assistance
- CRF funds are still being used only for emergency shelter placement in motels and is available in Bladen, Scotland, and Columbus counties as well.

- Call 211 for intakes to be referred through the state
- Back at Home Florence funding still available "Referrals still accepted"
- As stated at the previous meeting, for emergency housing placement for SFVC, please call 739-8622 and ask for Tasmon.

6. PIT/HIC County

- New Information received for the PIT/HIC
- HUD approved that the unsheltered count does not have to be submitted this year.
- Will have to submit a sheltered PIT count (Shelters, Rapid Re-Housing program, Disaster Re-housing program, and Permanent Supportive housing program)
- PIT Count is set for January 27, 2021.
- My Refuge is continuing to provide food during this time. Serving as follows: Tuesday- Friday: 4:30-6pm cooked food in carryout plates and food from the pantry if needed Saturday: 11:30-1pm Sunday: Bagged lunches 1:30pm-2pm
