

- NC BoS was selected in 2021 to take part in HUD's CE Equity
 Initiative
- The initiative's goal is to support communities in improving housing outcomes and the human experience for Black, Brown, Indigenous and all people of color.




NC BoS HMIS Data

NC BoS HMIS Data




- Data clearly demonstrates that people identifying as White are prioritized at significantly higher rates than BIPoC.
- 85% of all people in the highest scoring category (15+ points) identify as White
- Less than 10% of people in highest scoring category (15+ points) identify as Black



NC BoS HMIS Data

Average Days Homeless by Race



NC-503 HMIS data for 2021 fiscal year where HMIS is measured by ES, TH, and time in RRH or PSH before Move-in Dates.

People identifying as Black are, on average, homeless for 29 more days than their White counterparts (128 versus 99 days)



Background Information

- From October 2021 October 2022 NC BoS met bi-weekly with HUD Coaches
- Developed an inclusive Core Team with a diverse range of local stakeholders to ensure the process is rooted in equity-based decision making
- Developed an overall results statement: All Black/African Americans experiencing homelessness in North Carolina Balance of State are swiftly assessed and connected to safe, stable, and suitable permanent housing and housing resources.
- Developed a targeted goal statement: By December 2023, North Carolina Balance of State aims to proportionally increase the high scores of Black/African Americans assessed through a revised VI-SPDAT to 43%.




Goodbye VI-SPDAT!





Pilot Timeline





- Pilot results will help determine points framework




Basic Steps

- 1. Use EDA and Backdate modes
- 2. Open the Project Start or Interim Update (as applicable)
- 3. Select the "NC BoS CoC CE Assessment Pilot" from the new Select an Assessment area
- 4. Complete the responses according to client answers
- 5. Click "Save"
- 6. Navigate back to the default Project Start or Interim Update to complete the VI-SPDAT
 - Don't forget to complete the CE Assessment question too!

 - Record the data for the appropriate Front Door or Coordinated Entry HMIS project and for the date conducted








