• Question 3C-10: Market housing and supportive services to eligible persons regardless of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, familial status, or disability who are least likely to request housing or services in the absence of special outreach



- Question 3C-11: Established policies currently in place that require all homeless service providers to ensure children enrolled in early childhood education or in school and connected to services
- Question 3C-12: Collaborate with local education authorities to ensure individuals and families who become or remain homeless are informed of their eligibility for McKinney-Vento education services
