## CoC Funding Application Overview

- HUD released NOFA November 22
- CoC App = Project Apps + Collaborative App
  - Strategic Planning Objectives
    - 1. Increase progress toward ending chronic homelessness
    - 2. Increase housing stability
    - 3. Increase project participants' income
    - 4. Increase number of participants receiving mainstream benefits
    - 5. Using RRH as a method to reduce family homelessness



- Clear guidance from HUD
  - "Rapid re-housing is a proven effective housing model. Based on preliminary evidence, it is particularly effective for households with children." CoC Collaborative App, 3A-5.1 through 3A-5.6
