Funding Announcements

HUD announced the FY2016 CoC awards on December 20.

- Included both Tier 1 and Tier 2
- North Carolina awards: www.ncceh.org/files/7890/

- BoS received 46 of 47 grants applied for
 - All renewal projects funded
 - 2 of 3 new projects funded
 - Not funded: Pitt RRH, was lowest-ranked project
 - New CoC planning grant funded



BoS received a total of \$8,409,964 in funding.

- Applied for \$8,522,014
- Received \$8,409,964

Renewal projects	43 grants	\$7,888,001
New projects	2 grants (both PSH)	\$206,620
CoC planning	1 grant	\$315,343

SSVF applicants have begun requesting letters of support from the BoS.



Workgroup needed to explore new Steering Committee structure

- Steering Committee voting representation changes today from 26 to 13 people
 - BoS CoC can explore adding other voices to Steering Committee without conflict of interest who could:
 - Add larger regional or statewide perspective
 - Potentially advocate for or connect BoS CoC to important resources
 - Increase participation within BoS CoC for systems outside of homeless providers
 - Call for volunteers to form a workgroup to explore a new Steering Committee structure
 - 2-3 meeting over the next 4 months

Veterans Homelessness

Veteran Subcommittee reviewed and recommended the Veteran Plan.

Draft of the plan is posted on NCCEH website:
 www.ncceh.org/files/7830/

- Working in partnership to develop a plan to end veterans homelessness in the BoS CoC
 - Establish 13 regional veteran systems to create systems that quickly identify and house homeless veterans
 - Meet USICH Benchmarks and Criteria



Plan allows for better coordination and accountability for homeless veterans.

- SSVF grantees, CoC staff, and Regional Committees will partner
- Develop a by-name list for each Regional Committee so systems do not lose track of veterans
- Veterans Subcommittee will provide oversight for regional systems and address barriers that communities face



SSVF grantees would play a primary role in regional veteran systems.

- SSVF grantees will work with Regional Committees to develop and submit a regional plan on how to outreach, refer, shelter and house veterans
- SSVF providers will play the role of navigator in the system for homeless veterans to connect to permanent housing quickly
- Regional Committees will need to partner in order to serve veterans who are not eligible for VA programs

Local plans need to be developed with SSVF and Regional Committees.

- Regional Committee/SSVF local decision points that need to be made:
 - Outreach
 - Shelter/emergency vouchers
 - Offers of permanent housing
 - Data tracking/by-name list responsibilities
- Will work to have these completed by April 1, 2017 to mirror the coordinated assessment planning process



The Veterans Subcommittee recommends regional plan template.

• Template mirrors the CA Plan Template with shorter narratives and instructions for each question

• Template is organized by USICH criterion to connect the work to federal efforts

 - Finding volunteers & providing training
 - Distributing PIT/HIC forms to agencies & volunteers
 - Advertising count so homeless people know it's happening

Utilization rates under 65% or over 105% (esp. in PSH)	Contact Data Center to update inventory
