Governance Charter Updates



The NC BoS CoC Governance Charter has been updated to reflect changes in 2019

- Annual update is required by HUD
- NCCEH staff have made updates to reflect:
 - Code of Conduct
 - Racial Equity Subcommittee
 - Adding alternate/proxy for at-large members
 - Small typos

Code of Conduct Policy

- NCCEH staff will set of Code of Conduct framework for all Regions. Based off this framework, Regions will develop a Code of Conduct to include specific needs of the region.
- The policy shall cover conflict of interest in regard to serving on funding review and selection committees and abstaining from voting when there is a conflict of interest presents.
- The policy will be updated annually, and approval of the policy will be recorded in Regional Committee minutes.



Racial Equity Subcommittee

Responsibilities of the subcommittee include:

- Regular meetings throughout the year. The meeting schedule is determined by subcommittee members.
- Oversees implementation of the annual Racial Equity Assessment and analyzes data collected to create a final report for the CoC Application.
- Recommends data-informed action steps to the NC BoS CoC Steering Committee to improve equity across the CoC.

Statement of inclusion

The NC BoS CoC believes that inclusion is a critical part of developing and providing best practice homeless services.

For this reason, we are intentional that the members of the Racial Equity Subcommittee reflect the diversity of homeless service networks in regard to race, ethnicity, gender and gender identity, sexuality, age, education, ability, and lived experience with homelessness.

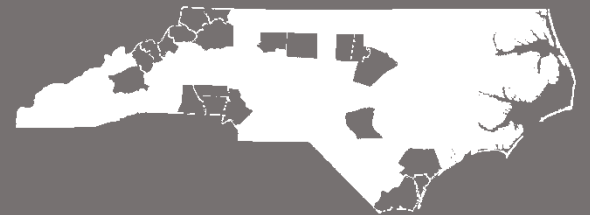

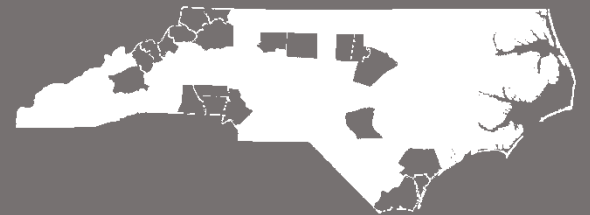

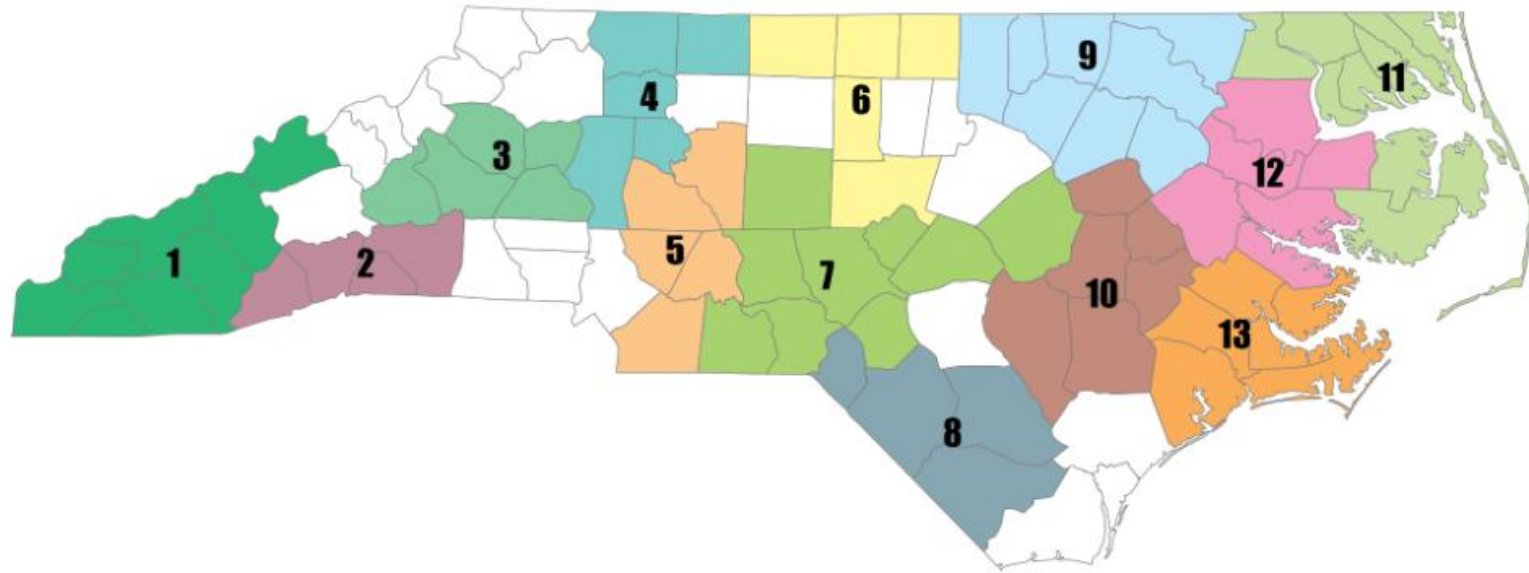


2020 Point-In-Time/Housing Inventory Count



Our goal for 2020

The NC Balance of State CoC will complete an accurate and comprehensive Point-In-Time and Housing Inventory Count in 2020 throughout all of our regions.



PIT/HIC data is an important tool and resource for your communities

Inclusive count of homeless populations

- Includes non-HMIS agencies

- Includes unsheltered homeless populations

Can use local and regional data to:

- Understand size/scope of homeless populations

- Assess system for gaps (do your programs match your populations needs?)

- Track increases/decreases

- Locate and engage unsheltered homeless populations

- Raise community and political awareness of homelessness

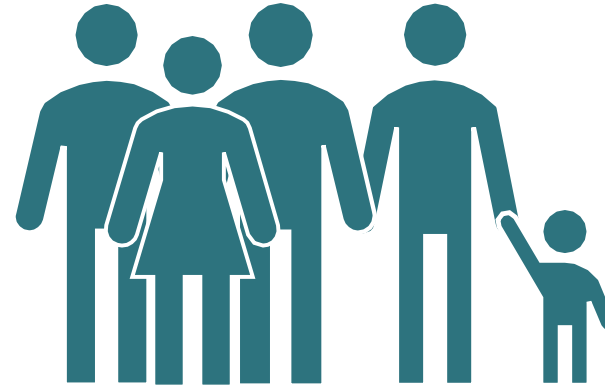

Key Terms

Point-In-Time Count (PIT)

Count of people experiencing homelessness on one night

Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)

Count of the beds in the homelessness system

Temporary: Shelters and Transitional Housing

- While here, people are counted as experiencing literal homelessness in the PIT

Permanent: Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing

- While here, people are not counted as experiencing homelessness – but we still use the surveys to inform our reports!



Point-in-Time Count (PIT)

Snapshot count of people experiencing homelessness (HUD Definition)

Unsheltered Count

People staying in places not meant for human habitation

Outdoors (streets, park benches, under bridges, etc.)

Tents/Encampments

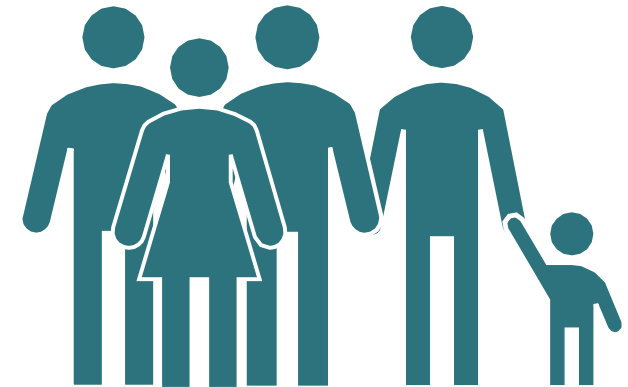
Vehicles

Bus or train stations

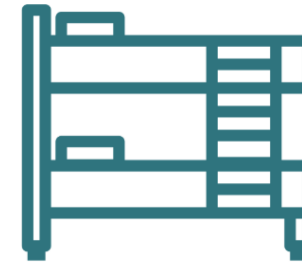
Abandoned buildings

Sheltered Count

People staying in **emergency shelter** or **transitional housing** dedicated to people experiencing homelessness

Counting Us App

- New/Improved from last year
- Used nationwide
- Includes expert technical support
- Includes all questions required by HUD
- Use on phones, tablets, computers
- Low-barrier access and use (does require sign-up)
- Ongoing training dates for everyone starting in November
- Available for agencies and volunteers to practice with starting in mid-November.
- App will "go live" on the night of the count
- Data submitted will be immediately able to be viewed, allowing for quicker response and reporting

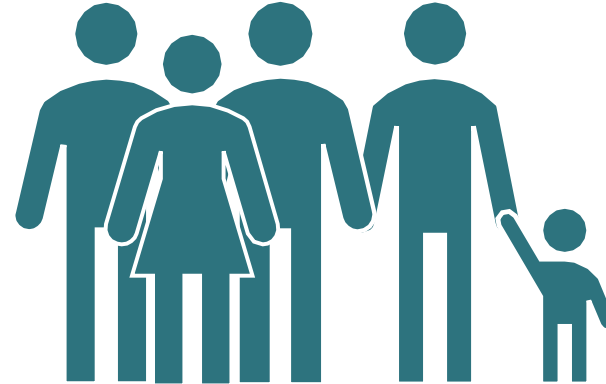

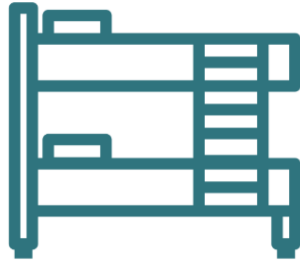

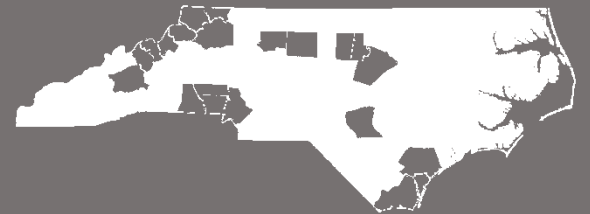

Family Reunification Vouchers MOA



2019 Family Reunification Program (FUP) NOFA has been released.

- For PHAs to serve:
 - Families for whom the lack of adequate housing is a primary factor in the imminent placement of a family's child in out-of-home care or the delay in the discharge of a child to the family from out-of-home care.
 - Youth between 18-24 who left foster care or will leave foster care within 90 days and are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless.
- Applications due December 17, 2019.



Requires a MOA with the Public Housing Authority, FUP Liaison, and CoC

- Details responsibilities to collaborate with
 - PHA
 - FUP Liaison: DSS, foster homes, etc.
 - CoC
- Requires
 - PHA to work with CoC and FUP Liaison to develop data tracking systems
 - PHA to attend CoC meetings (at least quarterly)
 - Participation in the CE process

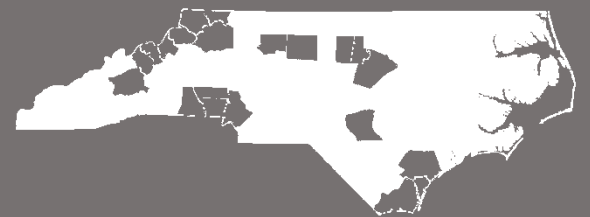

- Received results from 8/13 Regions
- Asked about satisfaction with the following CoC Staff support:

What did we get right?

- Staff was responsive to questions asked either during status calls, webinars, or through one-on-one contact.
- Staff created collaboration with regional partners to make sure it all got done.
- Staff posted materials to the website to be referred back to later.
- Phone calls and benchmarks created by staff helped regions to stay on a tight timeline.



Issues and Questions Raised

- Scorecard
 - Some found wording and jargon confusing
 - Lack of nuance and ability to negotiate points
- Staff Review of applications
 - Long turn-around time
 - Felt like running to separate competitions
- Overall Impression
 - Conflicting information from ESG and NC BoS CoC
 - Lack of Steering Committee input on the review process
