Roles and responsibilities




Roles and responsibilities

Unsheltered Access Coordinators

- Regional point person for providers
- Coordinate with regional CE Lead
 - Regional plan to connect people experiencing unsheltered homelessness to the CE system and BNL
 - Evaluate monthly progress on connecting people living unsheltered to the BNL
- Ensure data collection happens on all people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
- Engage all providers/organizations/stakeholders to understand the process
- Provide additional training to providers/organizations/stakeholders



What will the unsheltered PIT count look like?



Roles and responsibilities

CE Lead

- Partner with Unsheltered Access Coordinator to help support planning and action as needed
- Help with unsheltered count data entry as needed
- Help leverage relationships as needed

Community Partners/volunteers

- One agency/partner identified per county
- Provide information for planning
- Conduct surveys and collect data
- Enter data into HMIS or get to other party to enter data on their behalf



Unsheltered PIT Count

Gearing up for the 2024 upcoming PIT count:

- Can you say your region knows everyone who unsheltered?
 - Will you know in January?
- The NC Balance of State CoC Unsheltered Count will not occur without all of you. Why does this matter?
 - The information is depended on to inform stakeholders
 - Funding depends on demonstrating need through PIT
 - People living unsheltered are the most at risk for death
 - Leveraged for new and different funding opportunities



Unsheltered PIT Count

Unsheltered PIT Count will look very similar to last year:





Unsheltered PIT Count

Households on Region By-Name List must have BOTH data elements to be counted for Unsheltered PIT

- Current Living Situation date of PIT
- 2. Current Living Situation listed as Place not meant for habitation

Update Current Living Situation for clients on BNL


- Contact clients on BNL with Current Living Situation listed as Place not meant for habitation
- Verify if household was unsheltered on night of PIT
- Update Current Living Situation in HMIS

Survey potentially Unsheltered Clients

- In-person or via phone
- Ask about the PIT night sleeping situation specifically
- Surveys are only valid if completed within 1 week after January 31
- Record in HMIS



What should I be doing now?



Unsheltered CE Workbooks

Why are we doing the workbooks?:

- Should be the regional plan just in written form
- Makes sure all areas and activities are covered
- Helps community and CoC see progress and gaps
- Spells out data plan so we make sure we have one for each provider
- Will be helpful for unsheltered PIT count



Wins and Challenges from last year

- Wins!!!!! (from 2023)
 - We were able to count households and have regional coverage in every region
 - Households were connected to the BNL and connected to Coordinated Entry
 - More providers on HMIS which means more comprehensive data
 - Continued PIT agency relationships all year long
 - More households now have a homeless history documented in HMIS
 - BoS used the data for the Special NOFO and had much better data available



Wins and Challenges from last year

- Challenges (from 2023)
 - UAC responsiveness caused some challenges and delays
 - Needed better data collection and HMIS data entry plans
 - Follow-up with households after PIT night did not happen everywhere or consistently
 - Late planning left gaps and confusion




Next Steps

What should I do now/next?

- Partner and/or work on the relationship between UAC and CE leads
- Start thinking about the unsheltered count and identifying gaps and action steps (the workbook is your starting point!)
- Outreach known and identify new partners for unsheltered surveys
- Plan when and how unsheltered surveys will happen
- Plan when and how data will get into HMIS
- Keep eyes out for resource information


