Approval of At-large Steering Committee Member

An at-large SC seat has opened mid-year since Rachelle Dugan stepped down from the Steering Committee when she took a new position with NCCEH. Her at-large seat is open for the remainder of the year, from June - December 2024. The seat is reserved for persons with lived experience of homelessness (PLE) and is not restricted to one region of the CoC.

In the past, if an at-large seat opens mid-year, it is filled by someone in the same agency that employed the departing member. This precedent doesn't apply in the case of PLE seats. Rachelle was a member of the Lived Expertise Advisory Council (LEAC). To fill this seat, the LEAC proposed nominating another subcommittee member to serve the remainder of the term.

Karen Carroll has been nominated by the LEAC to fill the at-large seat. Karen has served on the LEAC since January 2024 & was recently elected as co-chair of the LEAC. She presented at the NC Bringing It Home Conference in 2024, alongside other members of the LEAC. She is an active participant in the Region 06 Regional Committee.

Crystal Gwendo motioned to approve Karen Carroll to fill the vacant at-large seat on the NC BoS CoC Steering Committee. Erin Joy Crossfield seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

The Project Review Committee has recommended the NC Office of Recovery and Resiliency (NCORR) for the transfer of the Northern PSH Combo, Pathways to Permanently Housed Combined, & Thrive Rapid Rehousing grants:

- Currently operating CoC Program grants for both RRH & PSH projects: Back@Home –
 Balance of State
- Already have a contract system in place and experience doing this work with local providers to implement grants
- Can meet match requirements, especially noting the large match for Northern PSH Combo

Amber Brafford asked if NCORR has identified an agency for Region 2. Jenny Simmons responded that in the proposal NCORR included agencies they'll be outreaching to and is confident that they will find an agency.

Karen Carroll asked when the money would be used and if it would be before the end of the fiscal year. Jenny answered that the projects are currently already in progress and households are being served.

Melissa Hewitt motioned to accept the Project Review Committee's recommendation for NCORR to become the grantee for Community Link's Northern PSH Combo grant & Thrive's Pathways to

Permanently Housed Combined & Thrive Rapid Rehousing grants. Brian Fike seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

 - o Participate in conversations about applicants
 - o Facilitate Regional Committee meetings to recommend agencies for funding
 - Ask questions about the funding proposal for your agency

- Make a motion related to approving or recommending an agency for funding
- o Represent the region on the Project Review Committee
- Vote on the Regional Review Form or proposed slate of applicants (Steering Committee meeting only)
- Avoiding a Conflict of Interest:
 - Make a plan now.
 - Who will facilitate the Regional Committee meeting to complete the Regional Review Form? Plan on scheduling this meeting between July 17th & July 30th.
 - Who will complete & return the Regional Review Form by 5 PM on Tuesday, July 30th?
 - *Note: The CE Leads & Webmasters do not need to abstain from providing attendance info for case conferencing & Regional Committee meetings for applicants


2024 Point-In-Time Count



How were sheltered people counted?






Unsheltered PIT Count:

Unsheltered PIT Count uses HMIS coordinated entry data entry.





Total People Counted by Region 2024




Total People Counted by Region 2024




Combined PIT Count

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Total Unsheltered People Counted by Region 2023-2024




Unsheltered PIT Across NC BoS CoC

Blue: Total Unsheltered PIT 1-200 per county



Total Veterans Counted down to 134 from 176




Total Chronically Homeless Counted up to 572 from 253




2024 NC BoS CoC Housing Inventory Count


HMIS Bed Coverage

Staff led a discussion with the following questions:

- What matches your experience in your sector or region?
- What do you see missing from this information?
- What is due to the way we counted? Or changes need or resources?
- What would you prioritize?

Crystal Gwendo noted that January is not the best time to get representation for communities as that is normally when people hunker down. She added it is difficult to justify funding when the current data is only reflective of January.

Karen Carroll asked how are people sleeping on couches or doubled up with families or families getting counted. Andrea answered that is unfortunately a gap in our knowledge as the HUD definition of homelessness doesn't cover those situations.
