





AO20 Data Quality Report



CoC's Data Quality Plan

- Required <u>Data Quality Plan</u> passed by CoCs in March 2023
- Coordinated Entry data quality standards set: https://www.ncceh.org/hmis/data-quality-benchmarks/



A020 Data Quality Monitoring

What is the purpose of this report?

- Strengthen data on an ongoing basis
- CoC's will review timeliness, accuracy, and consistency of your agency's report outcomes
- Based on providers results, Performance Improvement Plans may be required
- Every correction you make now saves you time in October!
 - However, agencies should review data internally at least once a month!



Celebrations!

Most Common Errors in CE Projects

- Date of Birth
- Disability
- Relationship to HOH
- Veteran Status
- Enrollment CoC
- Chronic Homelessness Calculability
- Residence Prior to Project Entry
 - Length of Stay in Previous Place
- Domestic Violence ?'s



How Errors Happen


- Not checking what front door agencies have collected when they identify someone or a household
- NCORR SSO projects and other eligible NCORR unsheltered populations*
- Not collecting more information at project start



Data Correction Plan

- Priority errors:
 - Name
 - DOB
 - Rel to Head of Household
 - NC County of Service
 - Enrollment CoC

- What is realistic for you?
- What is most important to you?
- Could we set a goal for corrections by September?



Back@Home referral workflow (1)

- Back@Home staff engages unsheltered household and enters them into their Back@Home SSO project
- Coordinated Entry Lead enters Back@Home SSO households into CE project
- Household is referred to Back@Home RRH (if appropriate) during case conferencing
- CE Lead records referral in HMIS
- Data Center sends NCORR list of referrals weekly



Back@Home referral workflow (2)

- Back@Home staff communicates during CE case conferencing they can accept households for Back@Home RRH
- Coordinated Entry lead filters BNL during case conferencing for households with highest acuity
- Household is referred to Back@Home RRH during case conferencing
- CE lead records referral in HMIS
- Data Center sends NCORR list of referrals weekly




NCORR compliance

- NCCEH data team receives list of HMIS ID for all Back@Home households
- Data team runs a report to verify:
 - ✓ Household was entered into the regional CE project
 - Household has recorded CE referral event for RRH



Veterans




VA Medical Center Referral Workflow

When an unsheltered Veteran household presents at the VA Medical Center...

- The VAMC CE Specialist/Outreach Team will email ROI, HART, and HMIS Client Profile forms
- The CE Lead will enter household in the CE Project
