Review

- HUD \$
 - ~ 20% is ESG (Emergency Shelter Grants)
 - block granted to states
 - OEO (Office of Employment Opportunity) administers in NC
 - ~ 80% distributed through competitive process
 - Continuum of Care

Continuum of Care

- Regulatory
- Created in 1994
- Agencies directly or indirectly connected to Continuum of Services
 - Street Outreach – Shelter – Transitional - Permanent
- Self-determine geographic boundaries
- The mechanism through which you apply for the competitive funds. Agencies cannot apply individually – must apply through CoC

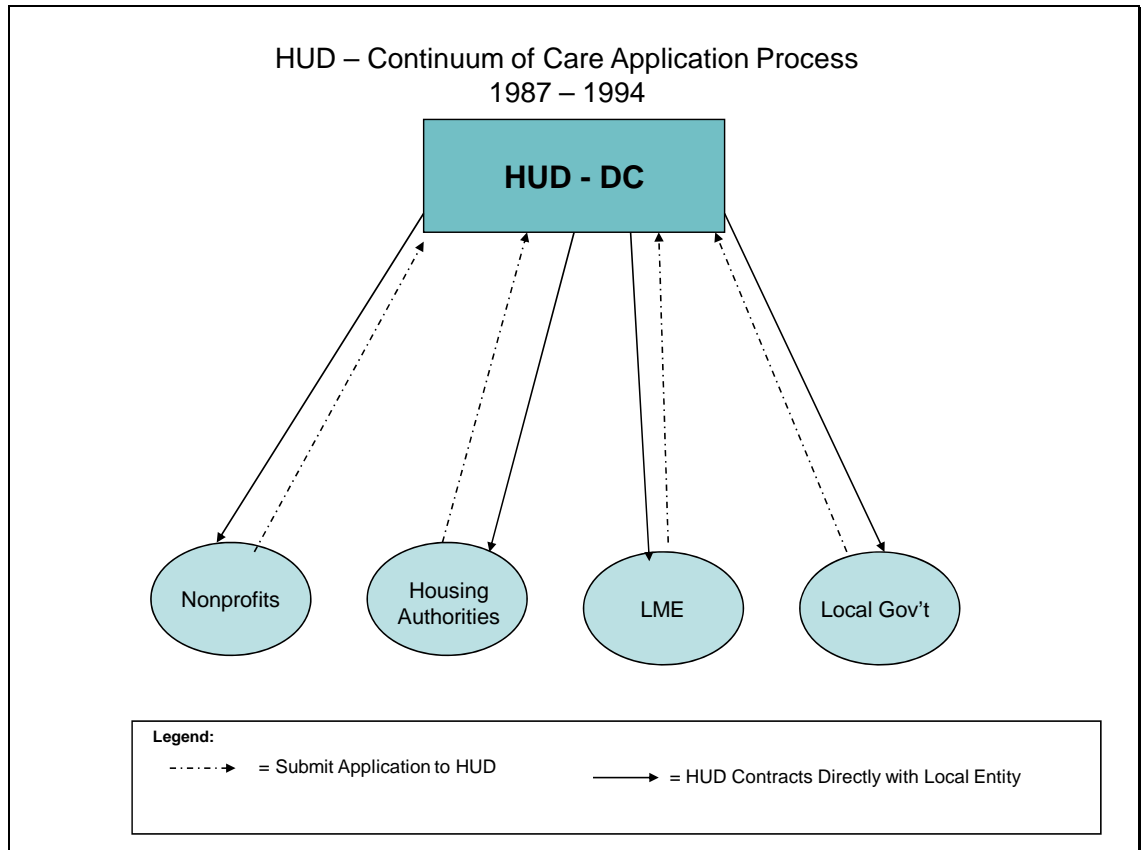

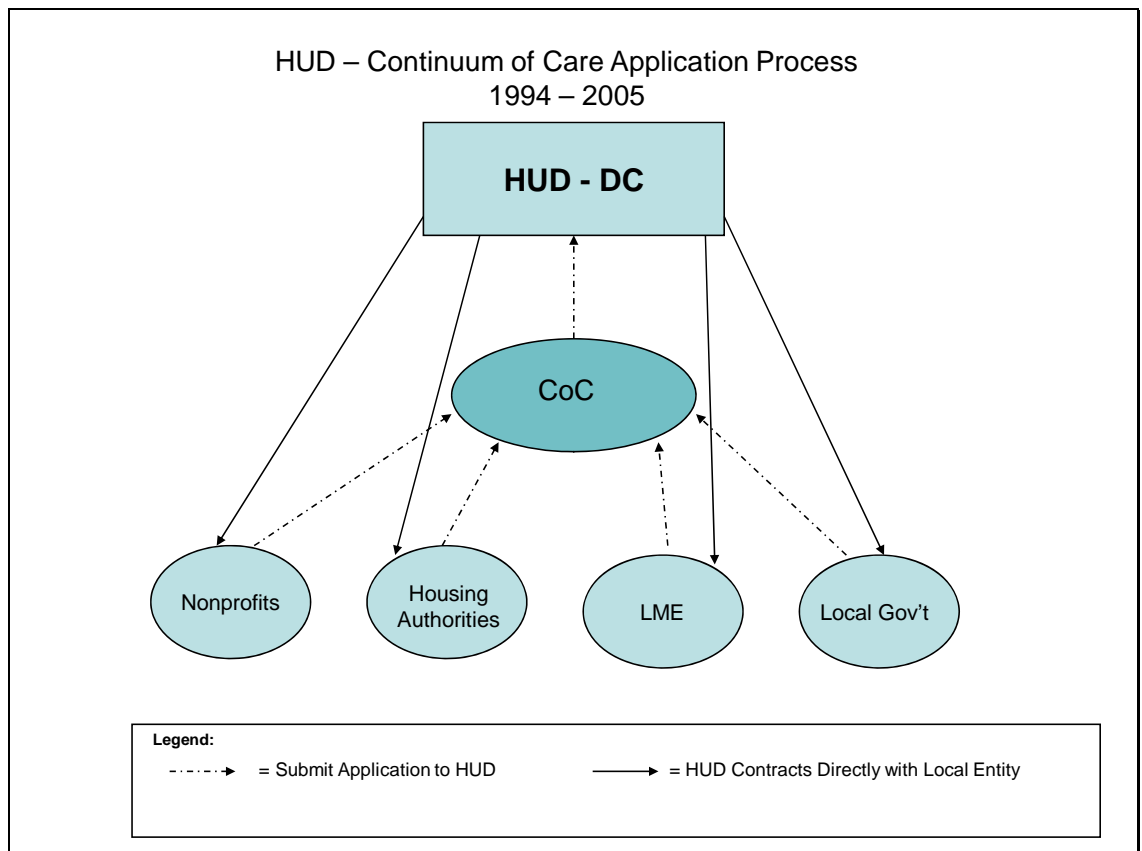

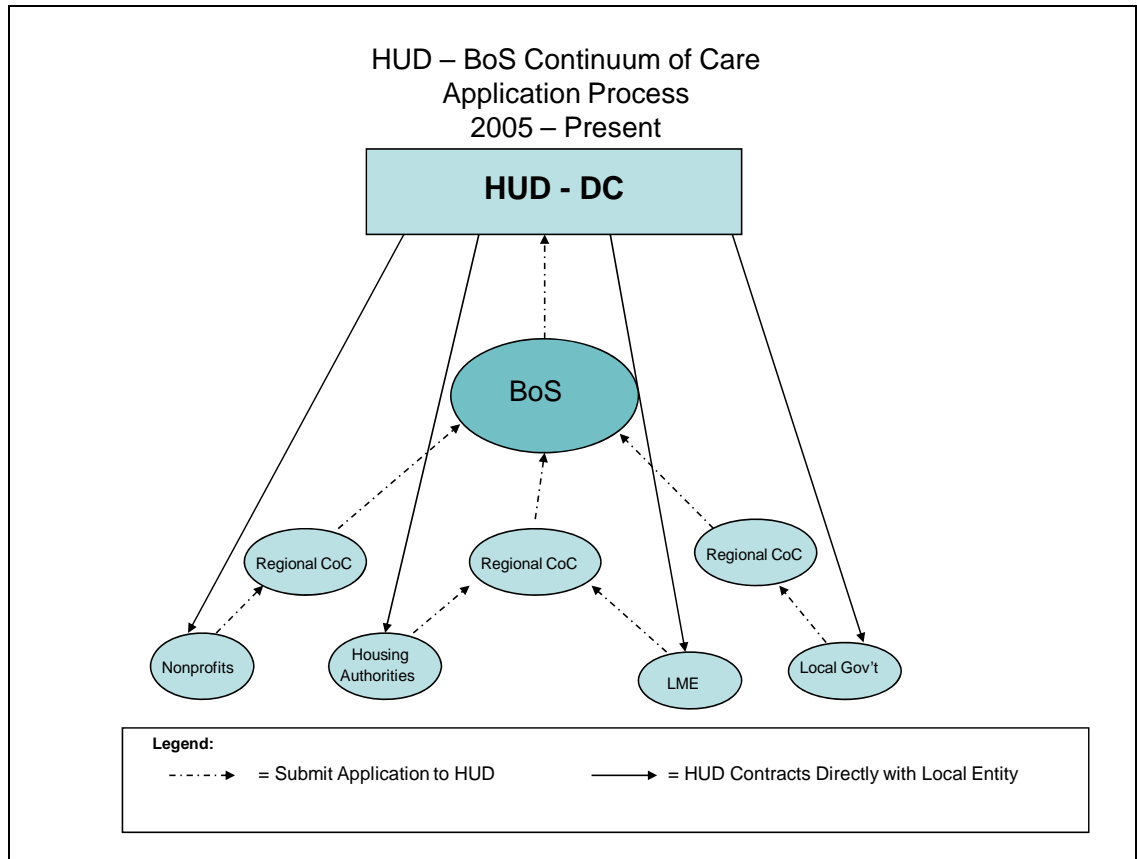

CoC: Supportive Housing Program

- **Transitional Housing**
 - People with Disabilities
 - Families
- **Permanent Housing**
 - People with Disabilities
 - Families that have a head of household with disability
- **2-3 Years for new projects**
- **Nonprofits, Governments may apply**

CoC: Supportive Housing Program

- Site based program
- Bricks & Mortar – acquisition, rehab, construction (100% cash match)
- Leasing – if you don't own (0 match)
- Operating - not if leasing (25% match)
- Support Services (20% cash match)

CoC: Shelter Plus Care

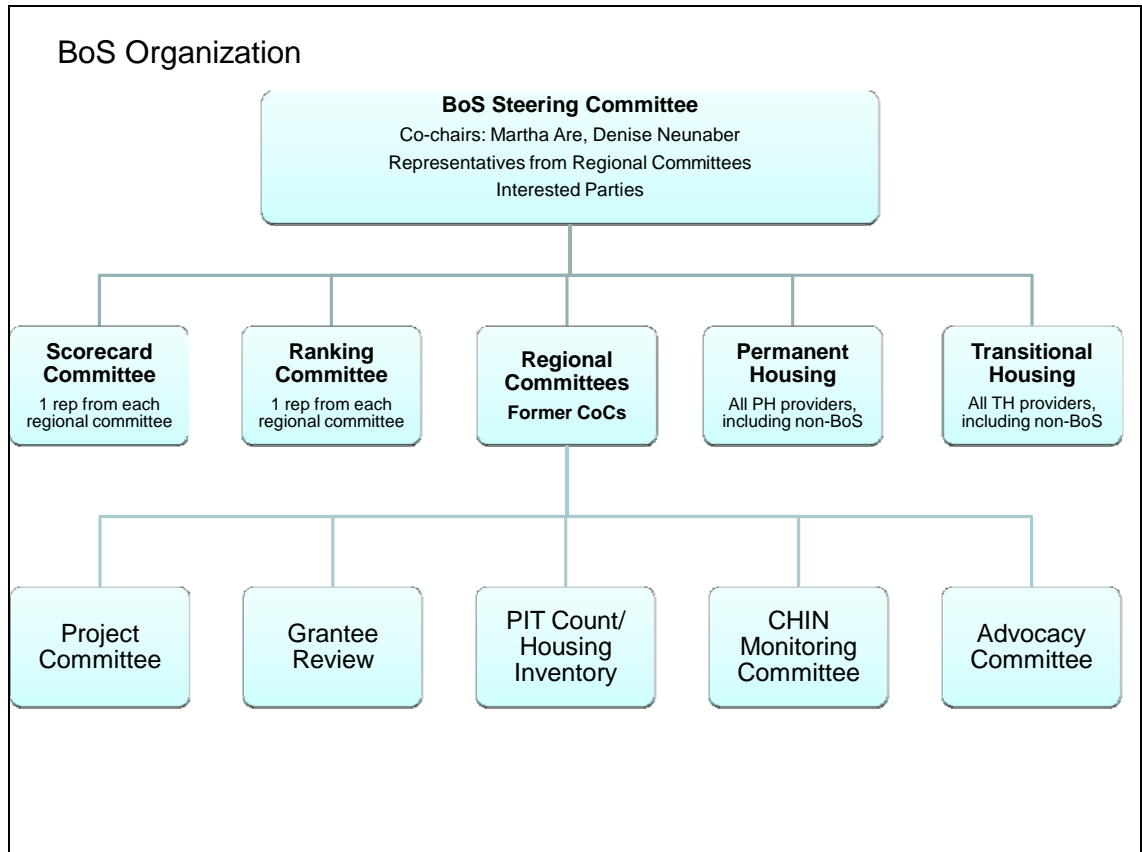
- Rent Assistance
 - Some Project Based
 - Most is Tenant Based (TRA)
- 100% Service Match
- Permanent Housing
- Individuals with Disabilities
- Families with head of household with disability
- 5 years for new projects
- United of Local Government must be applicant
 - Housing Authority
 - LME
 - Can sub

CoC: The Application

- Exhibit 1 – up to 60 points
 - Describes the community
 - Point in Time Count
 - Housing Inventory
 - Services Inventory
 - Goals/Priorities
 - HMIS
 - Etc.
- Exhibit 2 – up to 40 points
 - Individual project applications (SHP, S+C)

CoC: Scoring

- Exhibit 1
 - Based on how well you answer, what your data shows, etc.
 - Based on how well agency project applications (Exh.2) fulfill HUD priorities and mandates
- Exhibit 2
 - Based on pro-rata
 - If your project falls within the pro-rata cap, you can score up to the full 40 points
 - If your project falls even \$1 over the pro-rata cap, you can only score 20 points
- Score needed
 - Changes every year based on the competition
 - Usually low-mid 80s

Scorecard Committee	Develop scorecard based on HUD priorities and BoS needs that will be used to rank project applications	As needed	One rep from each region
Ranking Committee	Applies the scorecard to project applications to Score projects and provide feedback to projects on how to improve score. Provides recommendations to the Steering Committee for final application.	As needed	One rep from each region
Permanent Housing Committee	Opportunity for peer support and technical assistance and monitoring progress toward meeting HUD and project goals.	Quarterly	All permanent housing providers (including non-BoS)
Transitional Housing Committee	Opportunity for peer support and technical assistance and monitoring progress toward meeting HUD and project goals.	Quarterly	All transitional housing providers (including non-BoS)

Projects Committee	Determine what project applications should be put forward to BoS, rank project order as needed	As needed	Determined by local Regional Committee
Grantee Review Committee	Review APRs, Spending, HMIS participation	Quarterly	
PIT Count/ Housing Inventory Committee	Coordinate PIT Count, gather PIT and Housing Inventory data for BoS application	As needed	
CHIN Monitoring Committee	Monitor participation in CHIN, ensure quality data is being entered, assist in program evaluation	Monthly	
Advocacy Committee	Determine local advocacy needs, participate in state and federal advocacy with NCCEH	Monthly or Bimonthly	

Regional Representation on BoS Committees

Required:

- 1 rep. on Steering Committee*
- 1 rep. on Scorecard Committee*
- 1 rep. on Ranking Committee*

*each regional committee shall have one voting member, however all committees are open meetings and others are encouraged to attend

- **Regional Committees should also have at least:**
 - 1 PIT Count lead (or committee)
 - 1 Housing Inventory lead (or committee)
 - 1 CHIN Monitoring lead (or committee)
 - 1 Advocacy lead (or committee)

BoS: New Initiatives

- Monitoring Spending
 - Points
 - Knowing how fast grantees are spending money alerts us to possible problems before they are too difficult to fix
 - Begin at the regional committee level
 - Quarterly reporting to BoS beginning in January

BoS: New Initiatives

- Program Evaluation/APR
 - By 2009 application we will use HMIS produced APRs and program data to determine several factors in the ranking process
 - This year we will not use HMIS, but will demonstrate how your project would have fared if we had used HMIS
- Point in Time Count
 - By 2009 we want to be using HMIS for point in time count
 - In July 2008 we will do a practice run

Using HMIS to Evaluate Program Performance

- Assist directors in understanding the underlying forces:
 - What are we doing right? What activities contributed to our ability to meet/exceed our benchmarks?
 - Where do we need to improve? What activities fell short of producing the desired outcomes?
 - What else might be contributing to our outcomes? How can we influence or mitigate these external forces to further our positive outcomes?

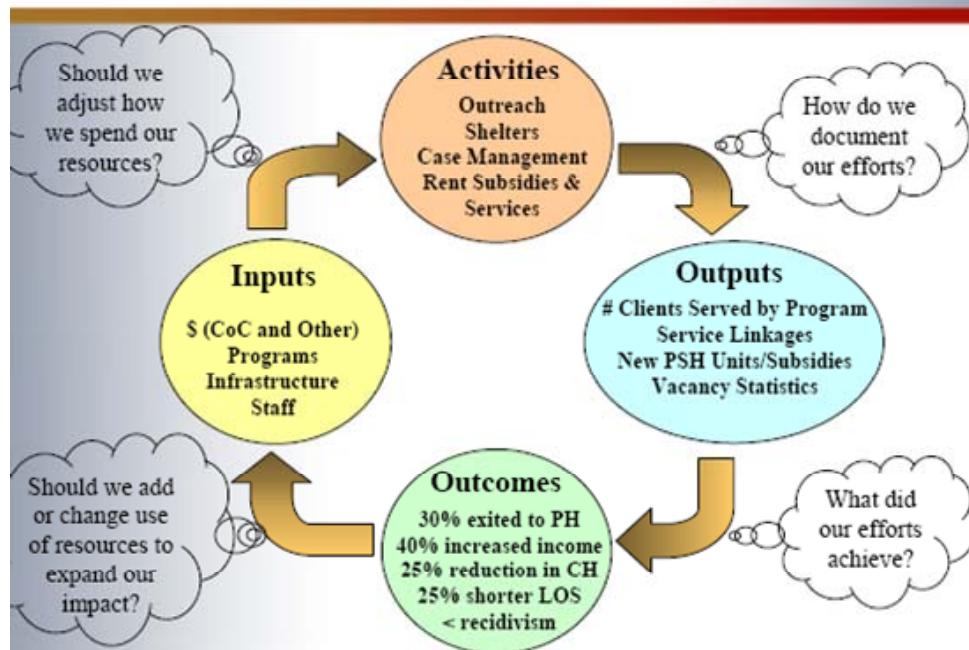
Using HMIS to Evaluate System Performance

- Are our actions achieving our intended goals?
 - Does the system work?
 - If yes, what makes it work?
 - If no, what part doesn't work, and how do we fix it to make it work?

New Initiatives: HMIS TA

- Extensive technical assistance will be made available to assist your agency in effectively entering data into HMIS
 - CHIN now has regional staff
 - Interim reports on extent of data entry
 - CHIN can also assist with reports on data integrity
 - Monitoring CHIN participation will be a Regional Committee activity as well as BoS activity
