
North Carolina 2012 Point-in-Time Count

On the night of January 25, 2012, in North Carolina,

13,602 people experiencing homelessness were counted.

This includes:

- 9,788 households
- 8,418 single adults
- 1,643 families
- 3,312 children under 18



^{*&}quot;Unsheltered" includes people staying in cars, in abandoned buildings, on sidewalks or the streets, or in other places not meant for human habitation.

12% (1673) of the adults and children counted were chronically homeless.

16% (2171) of the adults counted had a mental illness.

24% (3254) of the adults counted had a diagnosable substance abuse disorder.

10% (1413) of the adults counted were veterans.

12% (1651) of the adults counted had been discharged from a healthcare or criminal justice system within the last 30 days.

6% (780) had been discharged from a jail or prison.

4% (569) had been discharged from a mental health hospital or substance abuse treatment program.

2% (302) had been discharged from a hospital.
