#### DEFINITIONS OF TERMS

##### Homeless

Only people who are **literally homeless** according to HUD's definition should be counted in the Point-in-Time Count. This means that on the night of the count, they are residing:

- In emergency shelter, including domestic violence shelters,
- In transitional housing for homeless persons who originally came from the streets or emergency shelters, or
- In places not meant for human habitation (cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus/train stations, streets, campgrounds).

### **Sheltered/Unsheltered**

- **Sheltered** homeless persons are residing in emergency shelter (including domestic violence shelters) or in transitional housing for homeless persons on the night of the count.
- **Unsheltered** homeless persons are residing in places not meant for human habitation on the night of the count, such as cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus/train stations, streets, or campgrounds.

### **Rapid Re-Housing/Permanent Supportive Housing**

People residing in rapid re-housing and permanent supportive housing programs are **not** considered homeless any longer because they are living in permanent housing. Thus, they should **not** be included in the TOTAL column of homeless persons (Column D). However, because the numbers of people and beds in these programs must be reported to HUD in the Housing Inventory Chart, this information is collected during the Point-in-Time Count.

### **Chronically Homeless**

In 2011, the definition of chronically homeless was expanded to include both individuals and families.

- Definition: an unaccompanied homeless individual (18 or older) with a disabling condition **OR** a family with at least one adult member (18 or older) who has a disabling condition who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more **OR** has had at least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years.
  - The disabling condition can include mental illness, chronic substance abuse, HIV/AIDS, physical disability, or developmental disability.
