- SOAR referral info
  - SOAR is a program that helps to connect people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness with SSI/SSDI benefits
  - SOAR has released guidelines to help communities identify potential SOAR cases using questions from the VI-SPDAT

- Waitlists
  - Waitlists are one of the largest changes that comes with Coordinated Assessment
    - Traditional methods – clients served first-come, first-served; kept at the program level
    - With CA – clients served based on need; potential for community-wide lists
  - Catawba & Burke
    - People on waitlist from previous to implementing CA, are now VI-SPDATing these people, cleaning up list
    - Only taking referrals from folks who have VI-SPDAT
    - Community Question: How to share info without sharing sensitive info? Sharing agreements?
  - Onslow
    - RRH and PSH programs are at a standstill currently, have waitlist, not able to serve anyone yet but
    - Referral committee made up of RRH, PSH, SSVF, and shelters are other meet face-to-face monthly to look at list and VI-SPDAT scores, prioritize program placement based on need
      - This is working well
      - Helps to see what clients are shared among agencies
    - Community question: How can community be flexible when funding blockages occur?
    - As process is better understood, more and more people are interested in participating in CA – Salvation Army, jail diversion program now interested to participate

- Piedmont
  - Still in planning process, not sure about how it will work, like the idea of the referral committee
- Down East
  - Just starting implementation, will have Google Doc to share info where all programs will enter info
  - Community question: how to share this information?
- Information sharing
  - Communities have MOUs between agencies to agree to sharing info
    - Sample BoS MOU contains this language
  - DV agency participation – can use coding in place of the person’s name
- What to do when have very long waitlists?
  - Not a current problem as implementation just beginning
  - Community goal – have no waitlist, do not want people homeless and waiting for programs
  - What is best practice for length of waitlist?
    - Depends on community
    - If have no flow in PSH program, can think about graduation program
    - Always record info, don’t “close” waitlists in CA
    - Use secondary referral process to see assess community need
    - When to check in with folks who are on the waitlist? Depends on when people are falling off the radar, when emergency programs no longer serving people
- Tips and Tools
  - In Wilson-Greene, have found agencies are interpreting utility bill cut off notices/deposits/etc. very differently
    - City of Wilson coming to present to all agencies at the same time, get everyone on the same page
