- Intro of topic: BoS Coordinated Assessment trainings
 - NCCEH staff created online trainings for each of the 3 parts of the Coordinated Assessment tool
 - Prevention/diversion screen
 - VI-SPDAT
 - This training has BoS information before and after the standard training by OrgCode – the agency that created the VI-SPDAT
 - Case Management tool
 - Staff aimed for a practical solution re: these trainings, keeping in mind that many people work in a crisis setting, staff turnover can be high
 - Trainings are as short as possible, online, free
- Questions for the group re: training efficacy
 - How are the trainings working? Are they easy to understand? Are you hearing questions from staff after trainings? Is there any additional info staff should add to the trainings?
 - Participants responded that they like that the trainings are short and easy to understand
 - Regional Committees are using the trainings at meetings to introduce community members to the concepts of coordinated assessment, they help to increase understanding of terms and concepts
 - Training is the key to keeping scores reliable

- Onslow is not using the case management tool they have used a 27 point matrix for many years and want to keep using this to have information for funders
 - All Regional Committees implementing coordinated assessment are required to use the case management tool
- Henderson is talking with the creator of the software Charity Tracker about integrating the BoS prevention and diversion screen into their assessments
 - Other Regional Committees are also using Charity Tracker, this could prove beneficial for them as well
- General questions and comments
 - How are Regional Committees funding Coordinated Assessment?
 - Henderson has submitted an application to a community foundation for funding a Coordinated Assessment Coordinator position
 - This person would be a liaison between agencies, the Regional Committee, and BoS
 - Alamance uses a combination of funds from local CDBG, a local private foundation, and United Way to fund a Coordinated Assessment Intake Specialist
