Back@Home Move-In Assistance

Move-In Assistance refers to expenses not included in other Back@Home expense categories but which are directly related to supporting a participant's housing stability. Such assistance is offered only when it is not available through existing mainstream resources. Note that this assistance must be paid directly to a third party (not to a participant).

There are two classes of Housing Stability Assistance expenses, outlined below, that can be authorized up to maximums. Households may only receive the maximum move-in assistance one time during the disaster, though households may receive assistance multiple times while enrolled in Back@Home if the total assistance does not exceed the caps below.

- (1) Expenses with moving personal property into permanent housing: Eligible items are
 - Furniture delivery costs
 - Moving truck rental
 - Moving services
 - Furniture or personal property storage
- (2) Furniture and Household Goods: Households may only receive household goods that they do not already own and cannot acquire from another source. Eligible items include but are not limited to:
 - Furniture bank fees
 - Essential furnishings (beds and frames, dressers, couches, dining tables and chairs)
 - Bedding (sheets, pillowcases, and pillows)
 - Basic kitchen utensils and dishes
 - Basic small appliances (like microwaves)
 - Bathroom supplies (shower curtains, towels, toiletries)
 - Cribs
 - Cleaning supplies

Households are eligible for expenses up to the limits in the table below, unless a household includes fewer than one person per bedroom (e.g. a two-person household in a 3-bedroom house). In that case calculate the maximum assistance by number of people, not bedrooms (a two-person household in a 3-bedroom house would only be eligible for the 2-bedroom maximum). If there are multiple households in one unit (for instance, two adult roommates), they are eligible for a maximum for the housing unit, not per household (two adult roommates are eligible for the 2-bedroom maximum, not two 1 bedroom maximums).
