- **Region 1:** absent
- **Region 2:** Emily reports that Region 2 has conducted all trainings in every county except Polk county. They will be starting their counts on 1/31 from 7:30 AM – 2 PM in Transylvania County. She reports she has received notification from someone in Polk County stating they would be helping with the count, but she has not had an opportunity to train them yet.
- **Region 3:** absent
- **Region 4:** absent

- **Region 7:** Debbie reports that Region 7 is ready in 7 out of the 9 counties in that region. She reports she has an experienced county lead in Anson County so there is less of a concern the plans are not finalized, but in Montgomery County, the communication has been minimal and has not extended beyond an initial commitment to serve and fulfil the duties.
- **Region 8:** absent
- **Region 9:** Monica reports Region 9 is as ready as they're going to be although there is some natural anxiety. She reports she will be conducting individual calls with county leads. Last Friday, she made sure everyone had the app downloaded so they would be prepared for the night of the count. She reports Warren County is still on the fence about doing a street-based count, but all other counties have plans to try and conduct one. Each county will be conducting a service-based count and plan to have them all finished by the 5th of February. Service-based counts will be conducted at area soup kitchens and food banks. They have also identified a gas station that operates 24/7, so they will be visiting that location during their street-based count. Most counties are working with law enforcement to conduct their street-based counts, but they are concerned that rural counties do not have people who are experiencing unsheltered homelessness. Their street-based count will take place from 6-11 PM on 1/30.
- **Region 10:** Candice reports Region 10 thinks they are ready. She reports they continue to have issues securing a lead to replace their previous lead in Sampson County. They are planning service-based unsheltered counts in Duplin and Greene counties, and Wilson, Wayne, and Lenoir will be conducting street-based unsheltered counts.
- **Region 11:** absent

Planning Reminders

- Make sure your volunteers are reminded about charging their phones
- Make sure you let the Data Center staff know if you need to authenticate volunteers' accounts (hmis@ncceh.org or (919) 410-6997).
- Follow up to make sure your volunteers actually have the app downloaded prior to the night of the count so they CAN be authenticated.
- Make sure volunteers first ask if the person has already been surveyed to limit duplication (in the app)
- Make sure volunteers get consent (the app will ask)
- You may find that you have a lot of surveys that end sooner than expected, folks might have slept at a neighbors' family members, or friend's house the night before—this is normal, survey anyway and offer support, services information, and/or incentives if you have them.

Training Date	Topic
<i>January 25, 2019 @ 11 AM</i>	Data Collection for non-HMIS sheltered count

We will have paper surveys to use for the sheltered count for non-HMIS agencies. This training will cover that data collection process. We will be sending the non-HMIS agencies the materials they need to gather and record that data, and we will be copying the PIT leads on those e-mails. This will allow for the notification process to be standard across the board and hopefully lift some of the burden to communicate that down to through your county leads and then to each of the non-HMIS agencies. We still encourage PIT Leads and/or County Leads to contact non-HMIS participating agencies, especially after they receive the email from NCCEH, to ensure they understand what they need to do and ask any last-minute questions.
