



#### Your Voice Makes A Difference!

NCCEH continues to provide opportunities to convene, collaborate, and advocate to end homelessness in North Carolina.

- County-Specific infographics are now available on our website.
- Advocacy during Bringing It Home got results!
- Benjiman Horton wrote an <u>op-ed</u> opposing H781 and H437 that has been printed in several NC newspapers.
- Marshall Thomas with Spectrum News is working on a story about homelessness and the impact of these bills.



**RUSH 2 Funding – Letters of Support** 

Funded by the US Department of Housing & Urban Development, a second special allocation of "Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing" (RUSH) has been issued to address the impacts of Hurricane Helene on Federal disaster-declared areas.

These special RUSH 2 funds are to be used to address the needs of homeless individuals and families at risk of homelessness in areas affected by a major disaster, whose needs are not otherwise served or fully met by existing Federal disaster relief programs, including the Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) program.

The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) will administer North Carolina's RUSH 2 funds totaling \$1,910,417.

- Each applicant within the NC BoS CoC must obtain a letter of support for their application.
- 5 agencies submitted requests for Letters of Support for their applications for RUSH 2 funds.



**Pisgah Legal Services** 

Letter of Support request to provide *legal services* through a *Homelessness Prevention* program:

- Service area:
  - Region 1: Haywood, Jackson, Macon, Madison Counties
  - Region 2: Henderson, Polk, Rutherford, Transylvania Counties
- Funding amount: \$70,000 to serve approximately 50 households
- Participation:
  - Currently participate in Region 2 meetings & staff serving as UAC.
  - Acknowledge they need to participate in Region 1 meetings and state that they will.

#### **HERE in Jackson County**

Letter of Support request to provide *Emergency Shelter, Rapid Rehousing, & Homelessness Prevention* programs:

- Service area:
  - Region 1: Haywood, Jackson, Macon, Swain, Clay, Graham, Madison, and Cherokee Counties (including the Qualla Boundary)
- Funding amount: \$192,693 will hire a new f/t case manager for RRH & HP
  - Emergency Shelter: \$10,105
  - Rapid Rehousing: \$113,388 (\$20,800 for services; \$92,588 for financial assistance)
  - Homelessness Prevention: \$69,200 (\$20,800 for services; \$48,400 for financial assistance)
- Participation:
  - Currently participate in Region 1 meetings & serve as CE Lead agency
  - Current HMIS@NCCEH user agency

### **ESG Competition to Launch June 10th!**

- The Request For Applications (RFA) is to be released by the NC ESG Office, June 10!
- We will host a webinar for Regional Committee leaders on Wednesday, June 11<sup>th</sup> at 11 AM for those who need it.
  - Regional Review Form per region
- A webinar for all Project Applicants will be held on June 18<sup>th</sup> at 1 PM.
  - Project Applications will be due to NCCEH by 12:00 PM on Tuesday, July 15, 2025.

#### CY2026 Total amount available for NC BoS CoC: ?

The NC ESG Office sets a total amount that each of the NC BoS CoC's 13 Regions can apply for, the Fair Share.

- This helps make sure that funds do not get concentrated in one part of the state.
- Important for each region to work with providers to submit quality applications for ESG Program eligible activities that meet the needs of the Region and utilize the region's entire Fair Share!
- While the overall ESG award to the entire state will be \$5,169,928, which is a \$9,802 increase over last year, the NC ESG Office has not yet released each region's fair share.



# **ESG: Emergency Solutions Grant Program**

From the ESG Policy and Procedure Desk Guide

**Purpose:** NC ESG Program funds are intended to be used as part of a crisis response system using a low barrier, housing-focused approach to ensure that homelessness is rare, brief, and one time.


#### HUD's Priorities for ESG:

- Broaden existing emergency shelter & homelessness prevention activities
- Emphasize rapid rehousing
- Help people quickly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis &/or homelessness

For every activity type, ESG Program funding should assist people in accessing & maintaining permanent housing!

The Regional Review Form needs to be completed and returned by the deadline **of 12 PM (Noon) on Friday, July 25th** to be considered by the Project Review Committee to create the proposed slate of applications & for NCCEH staff to complete the Regional Application.

### **Conflict-of-Interest Policy**

- Persons attending Steering Committee or Regional Committee meetings representing an agency applying for CY2026 ESG Program Funding may <u>not</u>:
  - Participate in conversations about applicants
  - Facilitate Regional Committee meetings to recommend agencies for funding
  - Ask questions about the funding proposal for your agency
  - Make a motion related to approving or recommending an agency for funding.
  - Represent the region on the Project Review Committee
  - Vote on the Regional Review Form (at the Regional level) or proposed slate of applicants (at the Steering Committee level)



### **Avoiding a Conflict of Interest**





# HUD re-released a special CoC Builds NOFO on Friday, May 16th.

HUD re-released a new funding opportunity for construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation in a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) called CoC Builds on May 16<sup>th</sup>.

This NOFO supersedes the CoC Builds NOFO released last July 19<sup>th</sup>. Any applications submitted need to be reconsidered and submitted under the current NOFO.

HUD will select project applications to fund:

- New PSH specifically for people experiencing homelessness which must include capital costs budgeted for new construction, acquisition, or rehabilitation; &
- Up to 20% of an award for CoC Program eligible activities & costs associated with such new PSH project & no more than 10% for admin costs



# HUD released the special CoC Builds NOFO on Friday, May 16th.

Under the NOFO, several entities are eligible to apply:

- State, county, municipal, or special district governments
- Federally recognized Native American tribal governments
- Public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities
- Native American tribal organizations (other than Federally recognized tribal governments)
- 501(3) nonprofit organizations

Faith-based organizations may apply on the same basis as any other organization.

The NC Balance of State CoC may apply for (1) project up to \$9 million (a second project specifically by Tribal Reservations or Trust Lands could be applied for).
