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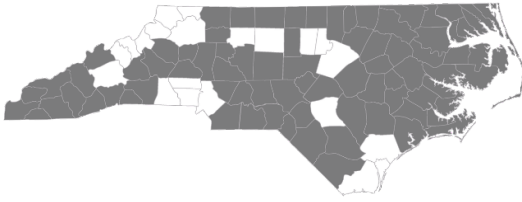

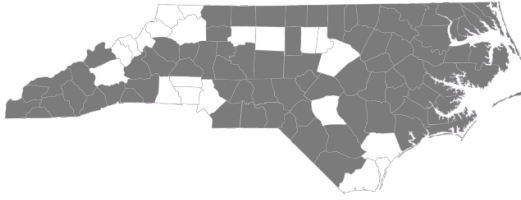

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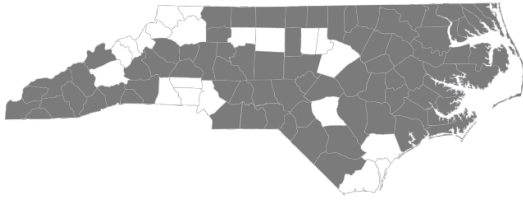

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Section III. Subcommittee Meeting Minutes Summary

Coordinated Entry Council

Occurred on Monday, May 18, 2026, at 10 AM.

The meeting focused on data quality monitoring, common HMIS errors, annual assessments, coordinated entry updates, and upcoming reminders.

- Staff reviewed the purpose of the A020 Data Quality Monitoring Report and emphasized the importance of accurate and timely HMIS data, noting that agencies with ongoing issues may require Performance Improvement Plans.
- Common data quality errors and strategies for preventing them were discussed, along with guidance on annual assessments for clients enrolled for longer than 365 days.
- Members also discussed concerns regarding agencies no longer participating in HMIS and troubleshooting sharing and visibility issues within coordinated entry.
- The group reviewed Coordinated Entry grievance policy requirements and shared reminders about the open CE Evaluation survey period through May 31, 2026.

Funding and Performance

Occurred on Thursday, May 21, 2026, at 2 PM.

The Funding and Performance Subcommittee met on May 21, 2026, to review and revise the FY2026 CoC Program Competition Funding Priorities in preparation for upcoming HUD guidance and funding requirements. Staff provided an overview of the CoC Priority Listing process and discussed the importance of aligning local funding priorities with HUD directives while continuing to meet the needs of the NC BoS CoC system.

Members discussed NCCEH's proposal to separate the existing Funding Priorities and Project Review Policies into two separate documents. Members agreed that splitting the documents would improve clarity and organization and had no additional edits or concerns. Staff shared that the finalized documents will be posted on the NCCEH website under Funding Opportunities.

The group reviewed new HUD priorities outlined in the FY2025 Notice of Funding Opportunity, including increased focus on improving participant outcomes, economic self-sufficiency, outreach to unsheltered populations, trauma-informed care, and balancing project types such as Transitional Housing and Supportive Services Only projects. Members discussed how these priorities may require significant revisions to the FY2026 local funding priorities.

Discussion also focused on the Coordinated Entry (CE) Grant process and SSO-CE priority language. Staff clarified that NCCEH receives the full CE grant amount and subgrants funding to selected CE Lead agencies. Members requested additional clarification regarding the grant process and suggested revising the SSO-CE priority language to make it clearer, add numerical rankings, and incorporate additional low-barrier principles. Members also discussed the removal of the previous ESG funding requirement from this year's priorities.
